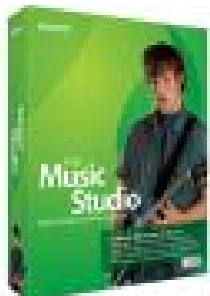


Beating the Holiday Blues
